Course Requirements

1. Thoroughly study the Lectures section of the *Prophetic Gestures* text. Then turn to the Questions section (approximately page 22) and carefully complete all exercises. While some may only require a one- or two-word answer, others will involve extensive research. The more effort and prayer you put into this study, the more prepared you will be for the Lord to use you in ministry. A significant percentage of your grade for the course will be based on the completeness of your answers.

AFTER you have completed the exercises for a Lecture to the best of your ability, compare your responses to those found in the Answer book and make any corrections necessary. Please make it clear that they are corrections and not your original work.

2. Earn at least a "B" on the Final Test. This is **NOT** an easy test. Extensive memorization of the course material is required. You should set aside a minimum of 3 hours to complete the test, and it may take as long as 9 hours. Be sure you are prepared before attempting it.

Course Schedule

Although there are only five Lectures (lessons) in this course, the amount of time required for answering the related questions is extensive. You should plan to spend 10 to 15 hours completing the Questions related to each Lecture.

At the end of the course, you will submit your answers to the exercises and your test to your instructor for grading.
